

Hurt Town Council held a special called meeting Thursday, December 20, 2018, at the Hurt Town Hall. The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. and a quorum was present.

Roll Call

Members present were Johnson, Bivens, Adams and Watson.

Absent were Neal and Clay.

Mayor Poindexter advised that Legal Counsel for Pittsylvania County is finalizing the documentation for the SRRIFA that must go to Richmond and has contacted each of the participant localities with any items that are incomplete, missing, or unclear. The Town of Hurt needs a roll call vote specifically approving the Cost and Revenue Sharing Agreement and authorizing the Mayor to sign and execute the agreement. This did not get included in the original vote earlier this year approving other SRRIFA documents. The agreement was presented again for review.

A motion was made to approve the Cost and Revenue Sharing Agreement as presented, and to authorize the Mayor to sign and execute the agreement.

Motion: Watson Second: Johnson Passage: unanimous

Mayor Poindexter advised the Bus. 29 bridge between the Towns of Hurt and Altavista would be closing December 31, 2018. He asked Chief Rowland what plans the Police Department has in place for traffic control. Chief Rowland indicated he has more patrols scheduled for Ricky Van Shelton Drive and Pocket Road due to the increase in traffic, but otherwise there is nothing more at that can be done until he sees what may change. Mayor Poindexter noted he would like to see a caution light at Prospect Road.

The Mayor also asked Chief Rowland for an update on the new police cars. Chief Rowland shared the town did receive a \$30,000 donation and someone would be at the office from VDHD on January 10, 2019 to meet with him and Mrs. Frazier to work on the grant application. Three 2019 Ford Taurus all wheel drive, one white and two black, fully equipped except for radios (which will be added once received) have been ordered and are scheduled to be delivered in late January or early February of 2019.

It was also suggested to repair and keep the Crown Victoria, after stripping all the police markings, to use for town business such as going to the bank, post office and meetings.

There being no further business, Council adjourned at 5:48 p.m.
